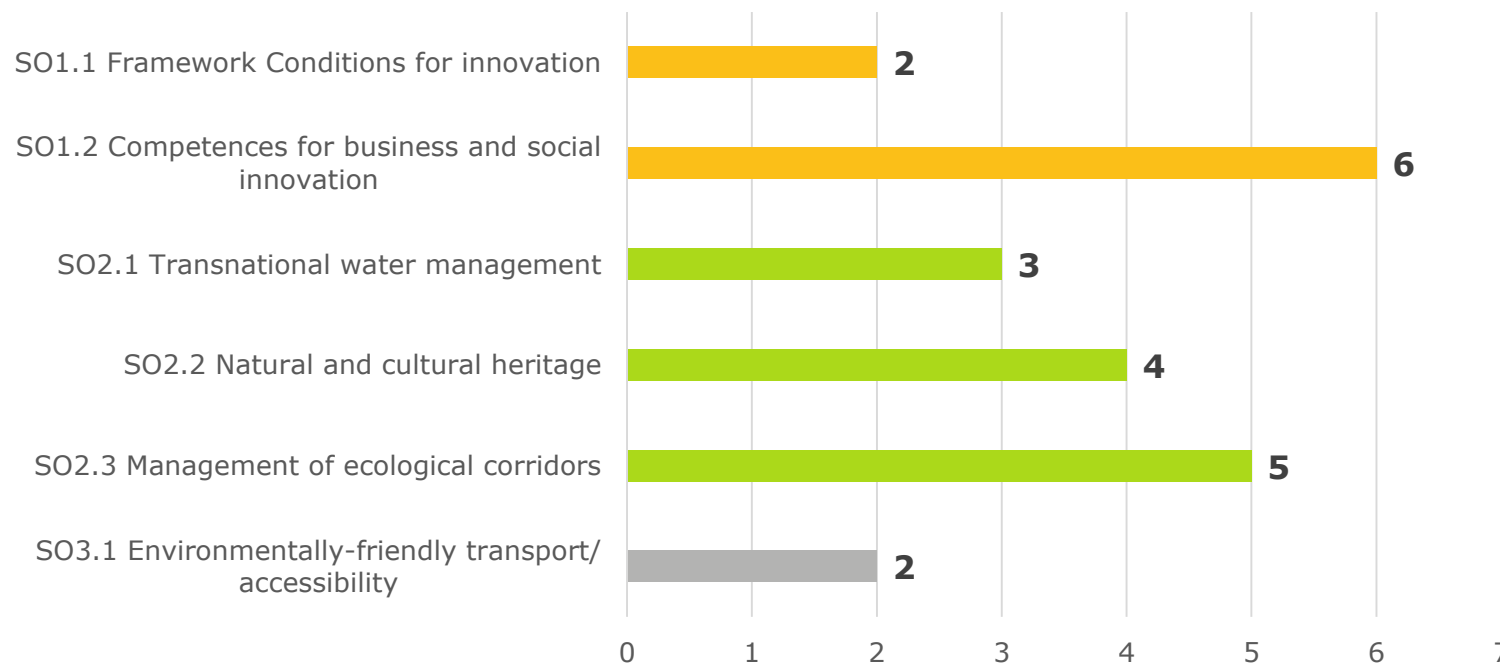

Danube Transnational – Results of the 2nd Call (1)

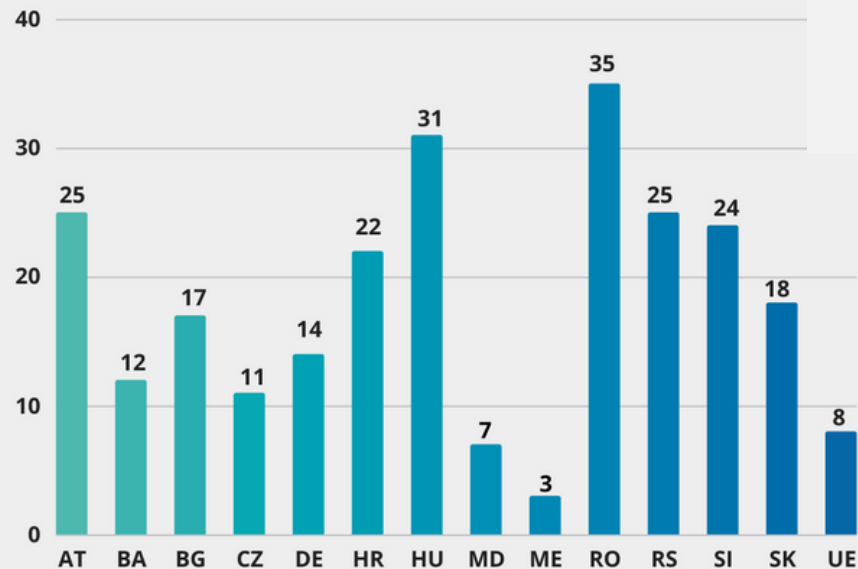
22 projects approved in 2nd Call

Approved projects according to Specific Objectives addressed

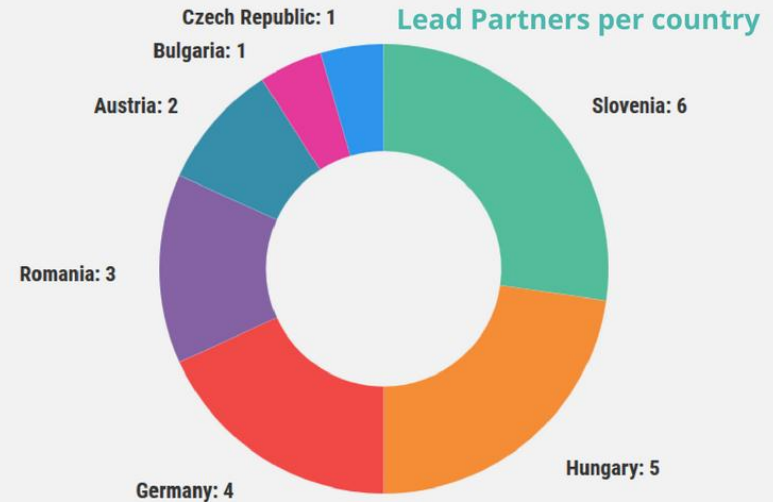


Danube Transnational – Results of the 2nd Call (2)

Project partners per country

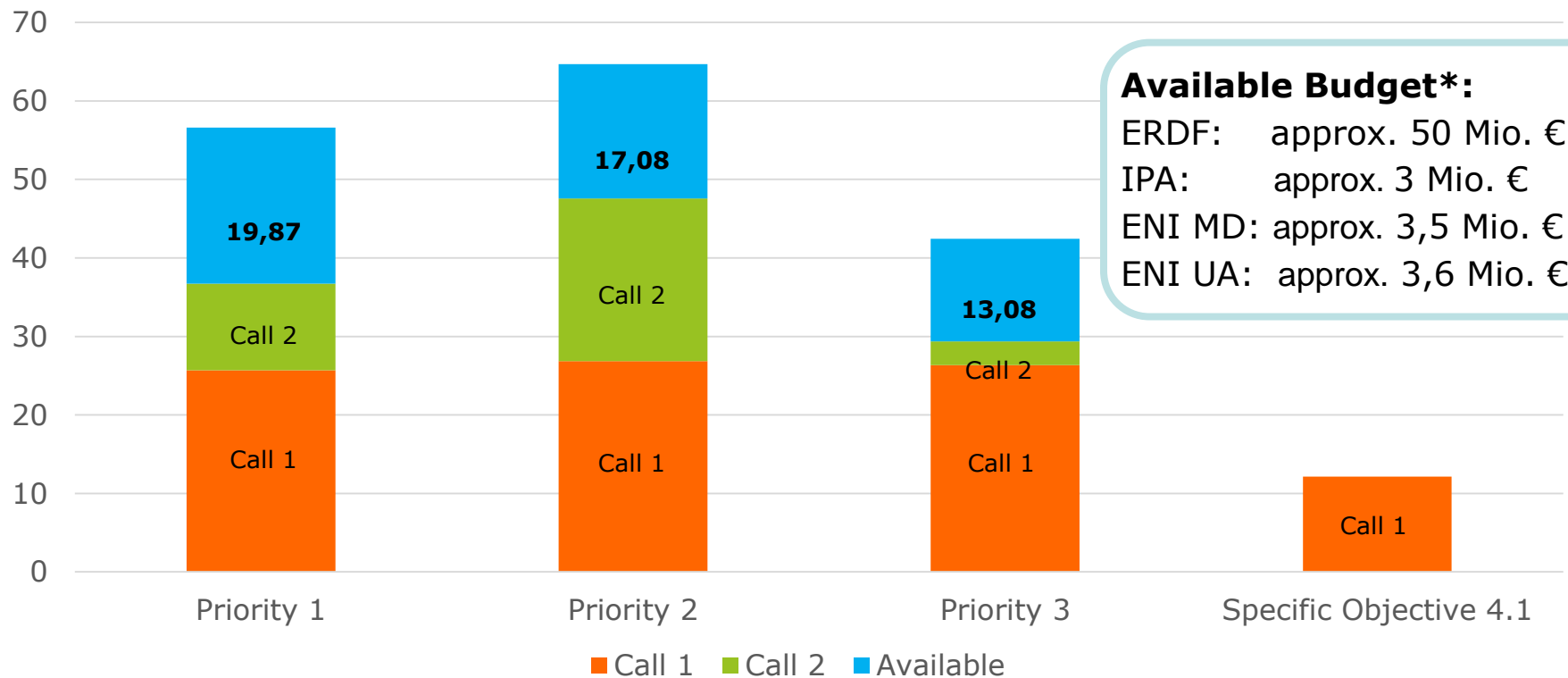


Lead Partners per country

ENI UA: approx. 3,6 Mio. €

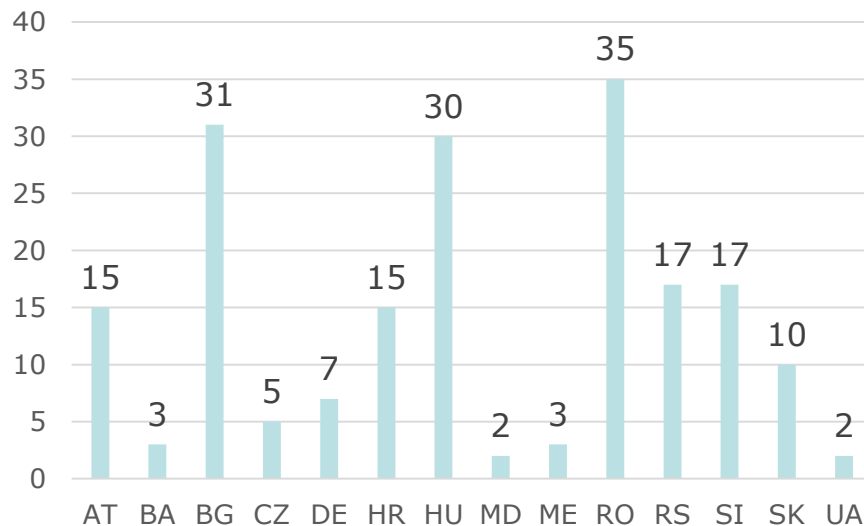

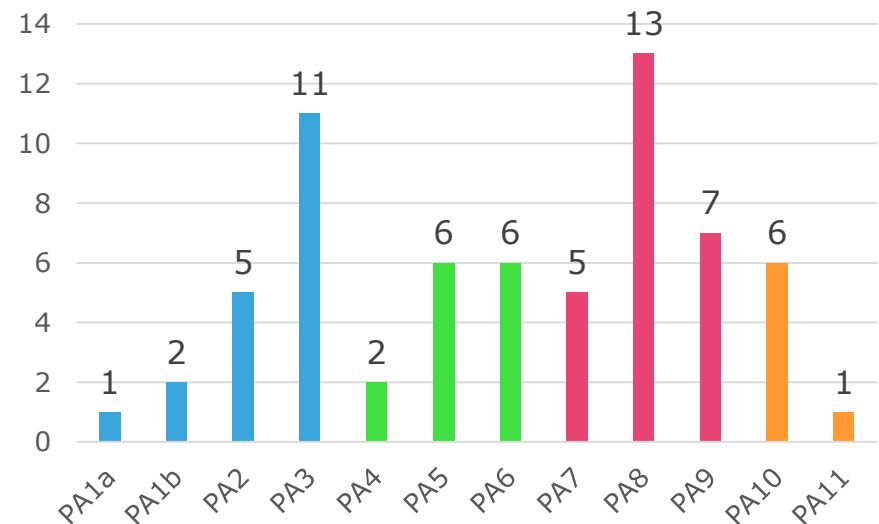


1st Call of the Seed Money Facility – Overview (2): Project applicants per country and per EUSDR priority area

1st Call of the Seed Money Facility – Overview (3): Applications in Priority Area 10

1. **ActiveHome** (Activation of homeless), LP = Development Agency of Savinjska region (SI)
2. **CAP-PES** (Capacity building for local PES offices implementing the YG initiative and for local stakeholders), LP = Association Romanian Center for European Policies (RO)
3. **CLEVER** (Co-designing smart Local solutions for Exploiting Values and Enhancing Resilience), LP = Baia Mare Municipality (RO)
4. **SSC** (Start of Smart Cities), LP = Municipality of Aksakovo (BG)
5. **SUFAB** (Sharing Urban Functions Across the Borders), LP = Central European Service for Cross-border Initiatives (HU)
6. **Civil bridges** (Danube Civil Bridges – Connecting NGOs in Danube Countries), LP = Mura Region – EGTC (HU)

Danube Strategy Point - Framework:

- Objective: **service structure for the EUSDR governance**
Background:
 - DSP initiated as EUSDR pilot action; host: permanent representation of Baden-Württemberg in BXL
 - Shutting down of DSP old in September 2017
 - Setting up of DSP new was agreed by NCs on 28th September 2017 -> to be financed by DTP
- Approved elements of DSP call:
 - Financing: until end of 2021; 85% ERDF, 15% national
 - Transnationality: min. 2 project partners from two different DTP countries or an EGTC
 - Declaration of Support of 3 NCs from 3 different EUSDR countries
 - Tasks: communication, support of EUSDR stakeholders, coordination of horizontal EUSDR issues, monitoring / evaluation of EUSDR, capacity building for PACs / non-EU countries, organisation of EUSDR annual forum

Danube Strategy Point – call process:

- Beginning of May 2018: Finalisation of Application Package
- 7th of May 2018: Opening of DSP call (through eMS)
- **11th of June 2018: Closing of DSP call** (at 15:00 CET)
- June 2018: Eligibility Check and Quality Assessment
- **18th July 2018:** Joint MC-NC meeting where a **decision** on the DSP project will take place
- Autumn 2018: start of implementation of DSP project
