



Cross border cooperation programmes in 2014-2020 in the Region:

14 ERDF cross border programmes – around 1.4 billion Euro

4 IPA cross border programmes - around 260 million Euro

Other IPA-IPA and ENI cross border programmes also available

Transnational cooperation programmes in 2014- 2020 in the Region:

<u>Danube Transnational Programme:</u> expected first call for proposal in autumn 2015 (topics: innovation, environment, transport, Institutional capacity and cooperation) Budget: 263 M EUR

Central Europe Transnational Programme: expected second call for proposals in the first half of 2016 (topics: innovation, low-carbon strategies, natural and cultural resources or transport) the first was closed on 13 April.

Budget: 231 M EUR
