Project description

Earthen buildings have long defined the landscape along the River Danube. In recent decades, earthen constructions were replaced by new building materials. However, earthen constructions are energyefficient and environmentally sound. They help form the distinct identity of a place – an increasingly important factor in terms of developing tourism and the conservation of cultural heritage.

Measures will be taken to (i) establish an inventory of existing structures, (ii) implement strategies for preservation, and (iii) prepare information material for public use (cultural institutions, ecotourism, etc.).

- Encourage local communities to revitalize earthen structures
- Raise awareness for the importance of earthen buildings
- Advance sustainable building techniques
- Preserve cultural heritage
- Identify best-practice examples
- Connect researchers and stakeholders involved throughout the Danube region
