3 thematic strands 2016:

- (1) Sustained and sustainable economic growth
- (2) Inclusive economic growth

Under each of these priorities, the event partners are invited to address challenges relating to ESIF programme management as well as to the cross-border, inter-regional or transnational dimension.



Sustained and sustainable economic growth

- Opportunities for regions and cities to foster growth and create more employment, in the context of the internationalisation of Europe's economies.
- Factors attracting new productive investment in the 21st century.
- New opportunities linked to innovation: energy efficiency, low-carbon economy, the circular economy, exchanges on smart specialisation.



Inclusive economic growth

- Development and implementation of labour market and social inclusion policies at local level for disadvantaged sections of the population.
- Social housing, public services and education, as well as measures to facilitate the setting-up of microbusinesses or small enterprises and to create an environment which is more "self-employment friendly".
- Share experiences in tackling the refugee crisis, including through the use of EU funds.



Making ESI Funds simpler

- Experience, good practice in raising efficiency and effectiveness of programme management, ways to simplify management and build administrative and executive capacities.
- Best practice in urban development, in integrated territorial investment programmes and community-led local development and use of new financial instruments.
- Early results of the **ex-post evaluations** for the period 2007-2013.





The European Week of Regions and Cities in Brussels. The annual four-day event is an inter-institutional platform for political communication, a means of capacity-building for regional and local stakeholders, and facilitates communication on EU affairs at local level. OPEN DAYS makes use of important moments in the EU agenda to get the message across to EU decision makers that regions and cities make a difference in effective EU policy-making and funding. The OPEN DAYS bring officials at EU, national, regional and local level together in order to exchange experiences and new ideas and to make sure that public money is well spent.



More than 100 workshops and various networking activities



December/January

Representatives from Europe's regions and cities gather in Brussels for the kick-off meeting of the OPEN DAYS – an annual event organised by the European Commission Directorate-General for Regional and Urban Policy and the European Committee of the Regions, during which event partners have the opportunity to showcase their capacity to create growth and jobs, implement European Union cohesion policy, and prove the importance of the local and regional level for good European governance.

Regions and cities matter because sub-national public authorities in the EU are responsible for one third of public expenditure and two thirds of public investments. At the heart of EU funding, there are about 400 cohesion policy programmes and over 100 programmes in the field of rural development and fisheries policy, worth about 500 billion up until 2020, aimed at ensuring smart, sustainable and inclusive development in all regions and cities.



The programme is published on the event website and online registration opens for around 6000 participants per

Local events "Europe in my region/city"

In an attempt to bring the messages of the OPEN DAYS closer to Europe's citizens, each participating region and city organises at least one local event on their home ground, to be held between September and November, under the heading "Europe in my region/city".

Many independent partners join this exercise of decentralised communication, and the European Cooperation Day events are also associated. According to estimates, the local events reach out to about 200,000 participants.

Local events are organised around the annual thematic priorities of OPEN DAYS. They are aimed at the general public, potential beneficiaries of EU regional policy, expert audiences, academics and the media and can take various formats such as conferences, workshops, radio/TV broadcasts or exhibitions.
